
Instruction: Having read through the passage thoroughly, match the most appropriate concepts or options numbered A-Q with the questions that follow.

Ama and Yakubu enrolled in a College of Education which is affiliated with Akenten Appiah-Menka University of Skills Training and Entrepreneurial Development (AAMUSTED) to be prepared and developed as professional teachers. As part of their education and training, they were required to choose from the three specialisms, namely early grade, upper primary, and JHS.

In the first semester, they were expected to take a compulsory course. This course sought to be a broadly conceived field of educational study that derives its character and method from several cognate academic disciplines in an integrated manner, involving areas of study such as historical, philosophical, psychological, and sociological dimensions of education.

Additionally, they were taken through the evolution of formal education in the Gold Coast, which was primarily pioneered by several missionaries, who wanted to propagate the gospel in the country. Notably among such missions were the Basel, Bremen, Wesleyan, Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, Islamic Societies, and others who helped to establish more schools in the country. Among other issues discussed during lectures at the college included the educational reform which gave birth to an ACT of Parliament that established the three major education regulatory bodies. One such regulatory body is known as the National Teaching Council (NTC), which has the mandate to professionalise teaching in Ghana. In line with its mandate, NTC has initiated several professionalization activities in teacher education in Ghana including the introduction of teachers licensing regimes and many others to regulate entry into the profession.
