a. Develop a monitoring plan that outlines how you will track the progress of your intervention activities. {3 marks}

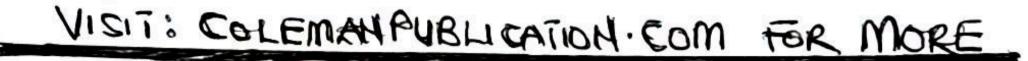
